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Science Network Partnerships Principles

These are the principles the UCS Science Network will bring to its partnerships with other organizations. We hold ourselves accountable to these principles, and ask that our partners help us uphold these principles by holding us accountable as well. You can read more about the mission and values of the Union of Concerned Scientists on our website.

- **Equity:** We believe that science should be a means—and not an obstacle—to reducing racial and economic inequity and ensuring that science-based policy decisions benefit all.
- **Diversity:** We value the skills, talents, and experiences that people of different races, ethnicities, sexual orientations, genders, ages, and economic classes bring. We recognize that expertise and knowledge come in multiple forms, and not just that which is legitimized by Western science.
- **Inclusion:** We share responsibility for creating a culture of partnership that invites the participation of all groups that support our mission. We respect and seek out the voices of impacted communities and marginalized scientists, recognizing we can learn from each other.
- Antiracism: We recognize and seek to dismantle structural systems of oppression that are built on White supremacy, so we can help rebuild the science community as an antiracist space that embraces the use of science to achieve justice. We acknowledge that science is inherently political, and that decisions about research, funding, data, and scientific institutions have broad social and political implications. Rather than deny these implications, we strive to be aware of them, to bring a diversity of voices to decisionmaking processes, and to break down the structural and institutional barriers that have harmed marginalized groups.
- **Community-based:** We believe that research and advocacy should be informed by and conducted in partnership with communities that have a stake in the outcome.
- **Redistribution of power:** We acknowledge that in science, power rests with privileged groups and institutions that get to make decisions about the distribution of, and access to, funding and data. Impacted communities and marginalized voices both inside and outside the scientific community must play a role in the distribution of these assets, and we seek to engage others in a position of privilege to join us in this work.
- **Respect:** We will take the time and intention to build relationships based on trust and mutual respect with organizations and individuals who share our values and will hold us accountable to them.

- **Transparency:** We commit to setting clear expectations and goals for partnerships from the very beginning, with buy-in from all partners.
- **Evolution:** We seek to continue learning about the historical marginalization that stems from and within the field of science in order to stop perpetuating it, and to continue placing equity and justice at the forefront of our collaborative efforts with partners. We recognize we will make mistakes, but will continue pushing ourselves to do better and be a stronger ally.
